



Meditation in the Wilderness

A Basecamp Retreat in the South San Juan Wilderness of Southern Colorado

Glacial Gorges. Waterfalls and babbling streams. Meadows of wildflowers. The crack of lightning and lasting echoes of nearing thunder. High in the mountains one comes closest to the Source, a place that gives birth to rivers and titillates the soul. One can explore much about themselves and their true nature in such a place. It is in the alpine roof of the world that we will go to reconnect with nature, to gift ourselves some time to practice.

In this unique opportunity we will participate in an age-old tradition of going into the natural world for support in spiritual practice and inquiry. This is a Buddhist Insight Meditation retreat, in which we will use meditation practices to increase our receptivity to the interconnectedness and beauty that surrounds us. It will be held in silence and will require a commitment by participants to this practice. Through our enhanced openness and stillness of mind we have the opportunity to deeply explore ourselves and our true nature. This retreat will offer a variety of sitting and walking meditation practices, Qigong sessions, and additional guidance through group interviews and individual meetings with the teacher.

This is a wilderness retreat designed for those of us who wish to deepen our practice in nature without the physical burden of a full backpacking trip. We will be hiking in to a base camp nestled in a stunning meadowed valley, from which we will see more of the surrounding mountain country in mindful day hikes. The only backpacking hikes are the four miles in and out, both over easy terrain. All group gear – food, kitchen equipment, tarps, and such – will be provided and packed in for you, and so your backpack will only need to hold your own personal gear.

To get to the camp, participants will need to provide and be able to carry their own personal equipment (tent, clothing, sleeping bag), approximately 30 lbs. For more information please check the website below.
